## COMMUNITY STATS

### Starting out 2026

- **Community Build-Out:** Waterbridge is 92% complete.
- **Current Development:** 1,044 homes are built or under construction.
- **Dues Status:** 1,100 lots are currently paying dues out of 1,136 total lots; all lots will pay dues by January 1, 2027.
- **Reserve Study Projection:** Inflation-adjusted 2023 reserve study estimated 2025 year-end balance at \$2.79 million.
- **Actual Reserve Balance:** 2025 year-end reserve accounts total approximately \$3.35 million.
- **Financial Health:** Reserve accounts are healthy and funded 17% above reserve study projections going into 2026.

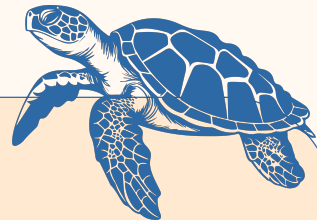

## EXTERIOR MAINTENANCE

### House Washing

Enjoy the beautiful January weather! Take a quick walk around your home and check your siding.

Many homes—especially in Phases 2 and 3—could use a wash. In Myrtle Beach, homes typically need a soft wash about once a year due to pollen, construction dust, and warm weather that attracts insects.

Hardie Plank - fiber cement siding can trap dirt and moisture, especially on the north and west sides, creating the perfect environment for mold and mildew. These usually appear as green patches that spread quickly.

**DIY Tip:** A gentle scrub with dish soap or a siding cleaner works well. There are many online resources for cleaning Hardie Plank – fiber cement board.

**Prefer a pro?** Local companies offer “pressure washing,” these companies use low pressure with cleaning solutions to protect your siding.

**Please take this opportunity to freshen up your home before Feb 15, when visible mold, mildew, or heavy dirt will be considered a CCR violation.**

### Landscaping

Why talk landscaping in January?

Now’s the perfect time for a quick bed cleanup! With plants dormant, it’s easy to spot pine straw, weeds, and even tiny pine trees. A light rake works wonders to clear debris without disturbing mulch.

Spring is the busiest season for landscapers, so if you wait until April–June for mulch refresh or cleanup, expect long delays. DIYers ordering bulk mulch may also face delivery backlogs.

If your beds look tired, schedule mulch and cleanup now for a fresh start!

- **Peak Hours:** November through March 6-9am and April – Oct 3-6pm
- **Layer Up:** Cozy sweaters and blankets can help you stay warm without cranking up the heat.
